Teachers, Parents, Students– Working Together for Success

In the First Grade Classroom

The First Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:



Teachers will send Trick Words home weekly in the homework folder for practice and will provide strategies on how to practice Trick Words.



Daily practice of adding and subtracting through whole group and small group instruction. The addition and subtraction math strategies will also be sent home in newsletters.

At Home

WPES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success in reading and math.



Parents will practice Sight Words for homework 3 nights per week.



Daily practice by doing homework to perform simple addition and subtraction stories.

Parents will check the folder weekly for what list their child is working on in class.



WPES First Grade Students

Students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Students shared the following ideas:



Students will practice Trick Words 3 nights per week with an adult..



Students will practice adding and subtracting daily.



Teachers, Parents, and Students believe these additional key points will create success for our First Graders this year:

1. Go to bed on time (By 8:30)
2. Limit TV time each day
3. Have a consistent place for homework
4. Read for 15 minutes per night
5. Attend the Parent/Teacher Conferences in October and March
