**Goal 1:** 100% of second grade students will increase their guided reading level by four independent reading levels based on guided reading assessments by May.

**Goal 2:** 85% of students will master second grade math fluency based on second grade standards by May.

### In the 2nd Grade Classroom

The 2nd Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success. Some of our key connections with families will be:



Students will have reading comprehension homework practice 2 nights per week. Parents will be provided comprehension strategies to use when reading with their child.



Students will have math homework practice 2 nights per week. Current math skills and strategies provided in weekly newsletters.

### At Home

WPES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success.



Parents will listen to their child read the reading passages that are sent home weekly as well as library books.

Parents will make sure their child has



correctly completed the math practice sheets each week.
